



Public Health Framework to Support Assessing Alcohol Licensing in East Sussex

October 2016

Introduction

This framework is intended to assist East Sussex Public Health and other responsible authorities in assessing Alcohol License Applications.

It analyses the following indicators at a ward level:

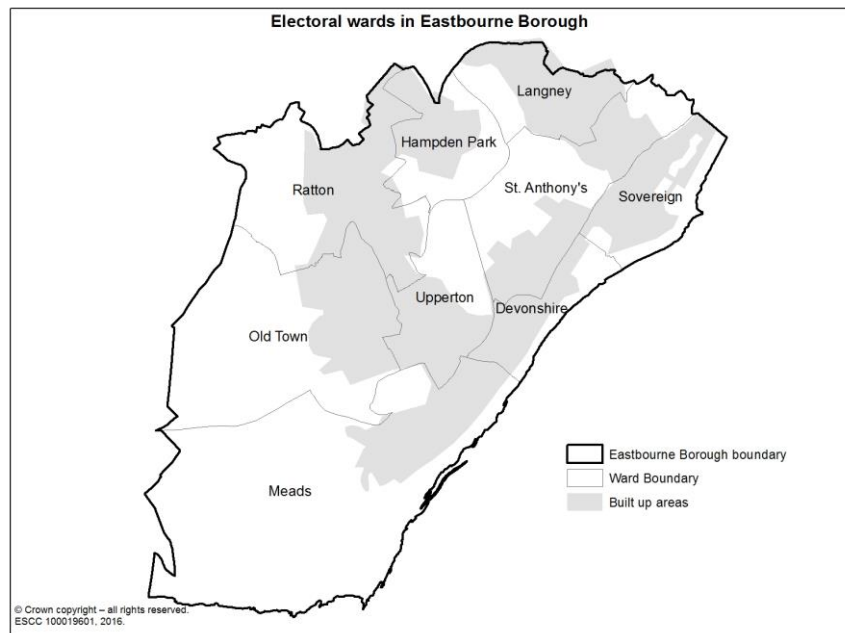
- Total crime
- Alcohol-related public place crime
- Criminal damage
- Alcohol-related ambulance call-outs
- Attendances at A&E during the Night Time Economy due to assaults

It considers both the number and the rate per 1,000 resident population for each indicator and ranks them by ward within an East Sussex context. Data is presented by district and borough.

The data sources, time period and any limitations are described in the table on page 3.

Alcohol-related ambulance call-outs	SECAmb	2015/16	<p>Ambulance patient clinical records (PCR) can contain a crew condition code for an alcohol-related call-out. There is an element of the crew on the scene making a judgement call as to the involvement of alcohol and as the PCR relates to the patient, not the perpetrator in the case of an assault for example, it is very likely to under-estimate call-outs that are attributable to alcohol.</p> <p>The ward is based on the location of the call-out. The incident does not necessarily relate to the residents that the rate per 1,000 is based on. Using a rate per 1,000 residents does not consider the throughput of people in an area (e.g. more people in an area where there are more licensed premises such as town centres and therefore more potential alcohol-related call-outs).</p>

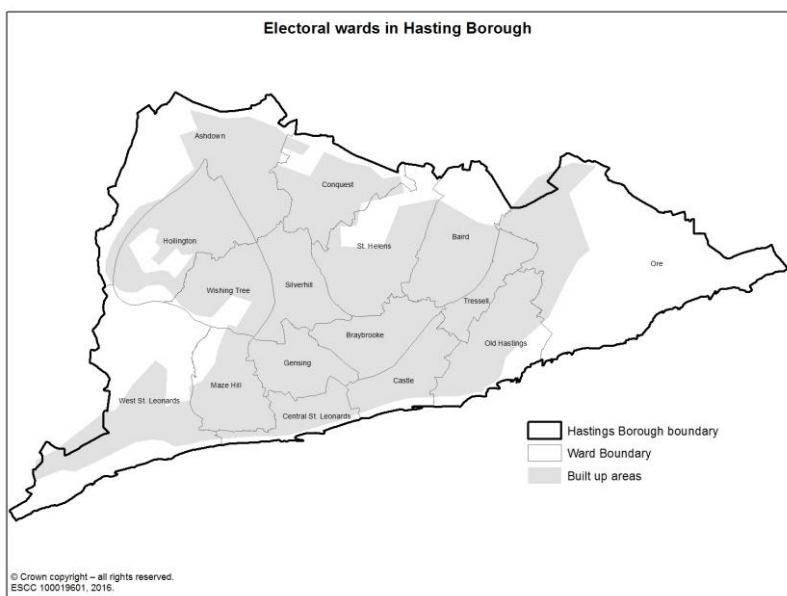

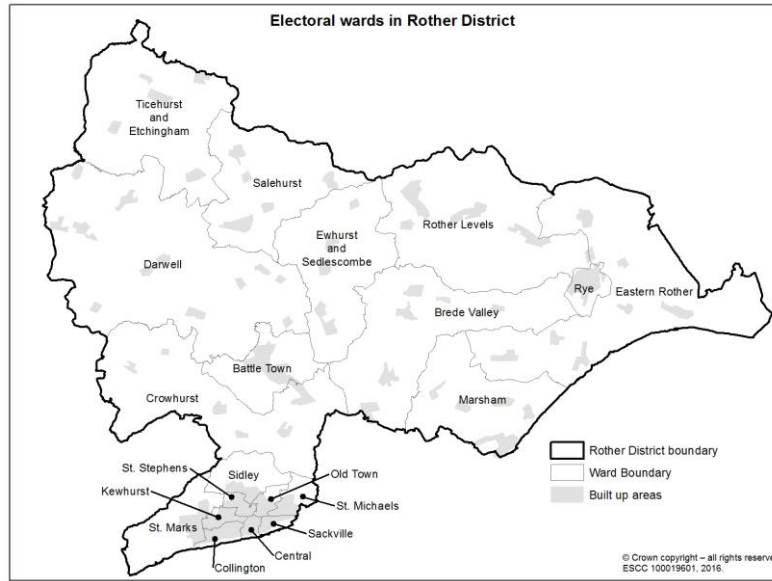

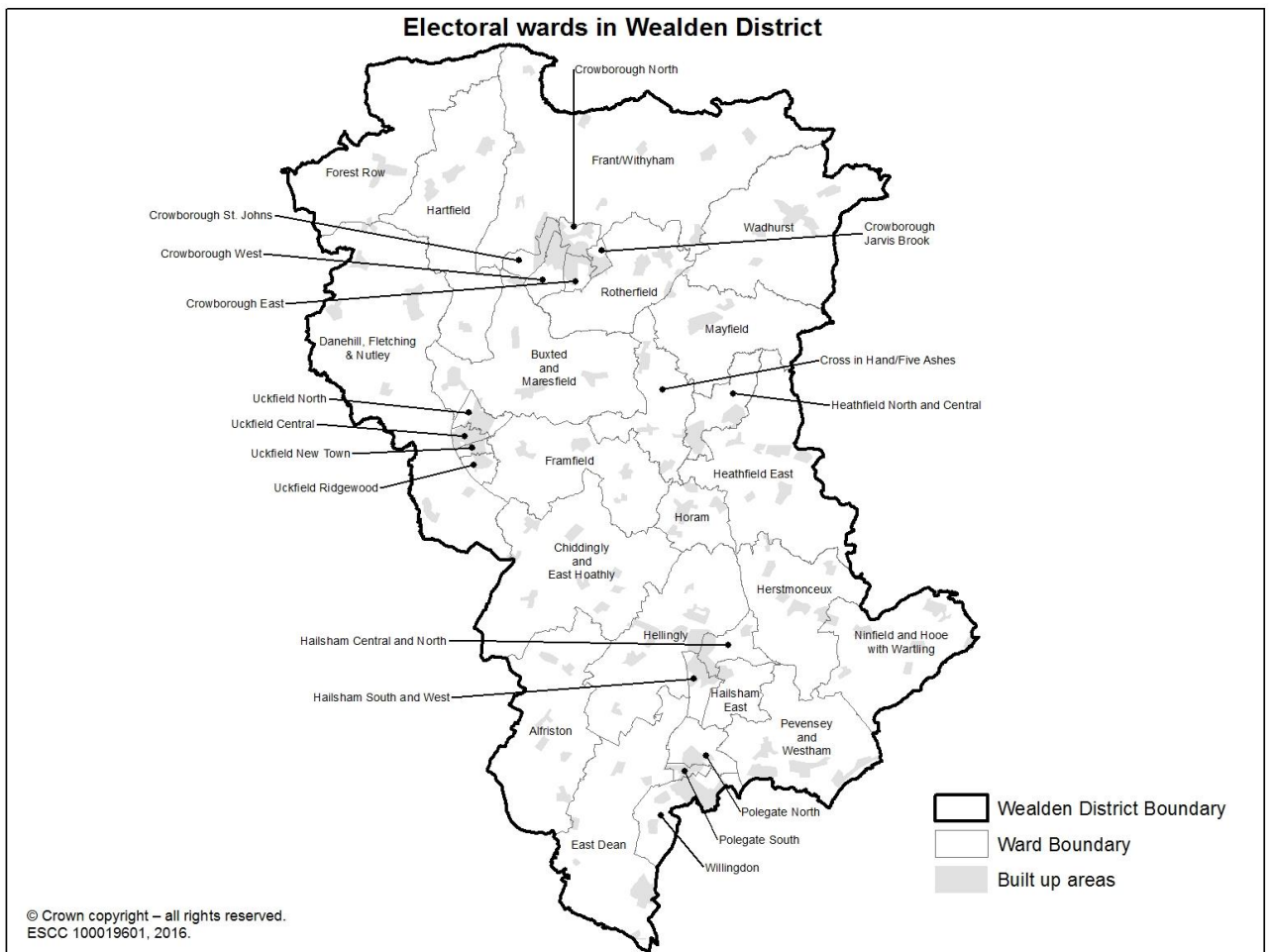
